Introduction to Amateur Radio Course - October 25 to November 18 2018

About Ham Radio

Come and learn all about Amateur Radio and prepare for the Basic level examination. Amateur Radio (ham radio) is a popular hobby and service that brings people, electronics and communication together. People use ham radio to talk across town, around the world, or even into space, all without the Internet or cell phones. It's fun, social, educational, and can be a lifeline during times of need.

Although Amateur Radio operators get involved for many reasons, they all have in common a basic knowledge of radio technology and operating principles, and pass an examination for the Industry Canada license to operate on radio frequencies known as the "Amateur Bands." These bands are radio frequencies allocated by Industry Canada for use by ham radio operators.

Getting started

We encourage you to get started ahead of the course, so review the links at the bottom of this page. To help get you started, download the Industry Canada Question Bank. The question bank has every question (and answer) that is on the Basic and Advanced test. You can take practice exams on the Internet using the actual questions from the exam bank and measure your progress as you study.

While the exam generator will help you memorize the correct answers it doesn't teach you the theory behind the question. Come to this class and learn why ham radio works as it does, equipping you with the skills you need in the field to fully benefit from your involvement in this hobby, plus you'll get instruction on how to operate properly.
